

LOUISIANA RETREAT ADDENDUM

This Louisiana Retreat Addendum ("Addendum") applies only to the retreat identified below that is held in the State of Louisiana (the "Louisiana Retreat"). This Addendum supplements and is incorporated into (i) the Company's Terms & Conditions and (ii) the Retreat Participation Agreement & Liability Waiver (together, the "Master Documents"). By registering for, attending, or participating in the Louisiana Retreat, Participant agrees to this Addendum.

1. Retreat Identification

Retreat Name: Covington Retreat 2026

Location (City/Parish; Venue): Covington, LA

Company: Blissful Retreats, a Maryland limited liability company ("Company")

Participant: The individual signing below ("Participant")

2. Incorporation; Defined Terms

2.1 Incorporation. The Master Documents are incorporated by reference and remain in full force, as modified by this Addendum for the Louisiana Retreat.

2.2 Defined Terms. Capitalized terms not defined here have the meanings in the Master Documents.

3. Order of Precedence (Conflict Rule)

If there is any conflict between this Addendum and the Master Documents, this Addendum controls solely for the Louisiana Retreat. If there is a conflict between provisions within the Master Documents, the provision that is more specific to the issue controls.

4. Louisiana Law; Venue; Non-Waivable Rights

4.1 Louisiana Law Applies. To the extent permitted by applicable law, this Addendum and any dispute arising out of or relating to the Louisiana Retreat shall be governed by

and construed under the laws of the State of Louisiana, without regard to conflict-of-laws rules.

4.2 Non-Waivable Rights. Nothing in this Addendum or the Master Documents is intended to waive rights that cannot be waived under applicable Louisiana law. If any provision is held unenforceable, it will be enforced to the maximum extent permitted, and the remainder will remain effective.

5. IMPORTANT NOTICE – ASSUMPTION OF RISK; RELEASE

PLEASE READ CAREFULLY. THIS SECTION AFFECTS LEGAL RIGHTS.

5.1 Assumption of Risk. Participant understands the Louisiana Retreat includes activities that may involve inherent and other risks, including serious injury, illness, property damage, and death. Participant voluntarily chooses to participate and assumes all risks of participation, whether known or unknown, inherent or otherwise, except to the extent caused by the gross negligence or intentional misconduct of the Company or other Released Parties, and except to the extent prohibited by Louisiana law.

5.2 Release (to the extent enforceable). To the fullest extent permitted by Louisiana law, Participant releases and discharges the Company and its owners, managers, members, employees, contractors, volunteers, agents, and representatives (“Released Parties”) from claims and liability arising out of or relating to the Louisiana Retreat, except to the extent caused by a Released Party’s gross negligence or intentional misconduct, or to the extent a release is prohibited by applicable Louisiana law.

5.3 Compliance with Instructions. Participant agrees to follow Company instructions, posted rules, and safety guidance. Participant understands that failure to follow instructions may increase risk of injury and may result in removal from activities or the retreat.

6. Water Activities; Swimming; Nighttime Activities

6.1 Water Activities Will Occur. Participant understands that the Louisiana Retreat includes swimming and other water activities (which may include pools, rivers, lakes, or other bodies of water). Participant acknowledges risks including drowning, strong currents, depth changes, submerged hazards, slips/falls, limited visibility, fatigue, and delayed emergency response depending on location.

6.2 Nighttime Activities May Occur; Potential Night Swimming. Participant understands that nighttime activities may occur, and that darkness and reduced visibility can increase risk of trips, falls, disorientation, and delayed assistance. Participant further

understands that swimming or water exposure may occur after dark, increasing risk due to reduced visibility and increased difficulty of supervision and rescue. Participant agrees to participate only if they feel capable and will follow all safety rules, including any buddy system, designated swim areas, or "no swim" instructions.

6.3 Participant Responsibility. Participant represents that they will not participate in any water activity if they are ill, impaired, overly fatigued, or otherwise not fit to do so, and that they will immediately notify Company if they feel unsafe.

7. Food Prepared On-Site; Allergy Disclosure; Shared Kitchen

7.1 On-Site Food Preparation. Participant understands that food for the Louisiana Retreat will be prepared on site by the Company (including by Company workers and/or volunteers).

7.2 Allergies Collected; Shared Kitchen / Cross-Contact Risk. Participant understands that although the Company collects food allergy information, all food may be prepared in the same kitchen and with shared equipment/utensils, and the Company cannot guarantee any meal or ingredient is allergen-free or free from cross-contact. Participant assumes the risks associated with food sensitivities and allergies, including serious allergic reactions.

7.3 Participant Duties. Participant agrees to: (i) accurately disclose allergies and dietary restrictions by the deadline in Section 9; (ii) carry any necessary medications (including epinephrine if prescribed); and (iii) ask questions and exercise personal judgment before consuming food.

8. Dispute Resolution – Binding Arbitration (Louisiana Retreat)

THIS SECTION LIMITS CERTAIN RIGHTS, INCLUDING THE RIGHT TO SUE IN COURT AND HAVE A JURY TRIAL.

8.1 Agreement to Arbitrate. To the fullest extent permitted by law, any dispute, claim, or controversy arising out of or relating to the Louisiana Retreat or the Master Documents/Addendum (including claims based in contract, tort, negligence, statutory claims, or other legal theories) shall be resolved by binding arbitration, not in court, except as provided in Section 8.4.

8.2 Arbitration Administrator and Rules. Unless the parties agree otherwise in writing, the arbitration shall be administered by AAA under its Consumer Arbitration Rules (or other applicable AAA rules) in effect at the time the arbitration is initiated.

8.3 Seat/Location; Governing Law. The arbitration location shall be selected by Company, provided that remote arbitration is available to both Participant and Company. If remote arbitration is not available, the arbitration shall take place in Louisiana, in or near St. Tammany Parish, unless the parties agree otherwise.

8.4 Small Claims Carveout. Either party may bring an individual action in small claims court if it qualifies.

8.5 Individual Claims Only; No Class Actions. Arbitration shall proceed on an individual basis only. To the fullest extent permitted by law, Participant and Company waive any right to bring or participate in a class, collective, or representative action.

8.6 Attorneys' Fees/Costs. The arbitrator may award any relief permitted by applicable law. Responsibility for arbitration fees and costs will be allocated as required by applicable law and the applicable arbitration rules, subject to any fee-shifting statutes.

9. Paperwork Deadline – All Forms Due 30 Days Before Retreat

9.1 Deadline. Participant agrees that all required paperwork and information must be completed and submitted no later than thirty (30) days before the Louisiana Retreat start date, including without limitation: signed Master Documents, this Addendum, emergency contact information, and any health/allergy disclosures requested by Company.

9.2 Condition of Participation. Timely completion is a condition of participation. If Participant does not submit required paperwork by the deadline, Company may (at its discretion) deny participation until completed, restrict participation in certain activities, or treat the booking as cancelled in accordance with the Master Documents' refund/cancellation terms (unless prohibited by applicable law).

10. Force Majeure; Changes for Safety and Logistics

10.1 Force Majeure Events. Company shall not be liable for delays, changes, or inability to perform obligations due to events beyond Company's reasonable control, including without limitation: severe weather, hurricanes, flooding, evacuation orders, power

outages, fires, public health emergencies, vendor cancellations, venue unavailability, travel disruptions, or other similar events ("Force Majeure Event").

10.2 Company Right to Modify / Relocate / Reschedule. If a Force Majeure Event occurs or Company reasonably determines changes are necessary for safety or feasibility, Company may modify activities, change schedules, substitute vendors, relocate, reschedule, or cancel the Louisiana Retreat.

10.3 Refunds/Credits. Any refunds, credits, or other remedies in connection with a Force Majeure Event will be handled in accordance with the Master Documents unless otherwise required by applicable law.

11. Third-Party Vendors; Excursions; Transportation

11.1 Third Parties. Some services or activities may be provided by third parties not controlled by Company. Company is not responsible for the acts or omissions of third parties except as required by applicable law.

11.2 Transportation. Unless expressly stated otherwise in writing, Participant is responsible for transportation to/from the retreat and to/from off-site activities. If Company coordinates any transportation as a convenience, Participant understands transportation involves risks and agrees to follow all safety requirements.

12. Emergency Medical Treatment Authorization; Information Sharing

12.1 Authorization. If Participant is injured or becomes ill, Participant authorizes Company to seek emergency evaluation and/or treatment when Company reasonably believes it is necessary for Participant's safety.

12.2 Information Sharing. Participant authorizes Company to share relevant information with emergency responders/medical providers and Participant's emergency contact to coordinate care.

12.3 Costs. Participant is solely responsible for all medical and related costs (including ambulance/transport).

13. Severability; Survival

13.1 Severability. If any provision is held invalid or unenforceable, the remainder remains effective.

13.2 Survival. Provisions intended to survive (including Sections 3–13 as applicable) survive the end of the Louisiana Retreat.

14. Acknowledgment and Signature

By signing, Participant acknowledges they have read and understand this Addendum and agree to be bound by it for the Louisiana Retreat.
